

Following the trail of manor houses and castles of the Northern Kashubian Region

You are welcome to visit the trail of manor houses and castles of the Northern Kashubian Region.

Bychowo Manor House is a perfect base for those wanting to get to the nearby beaches. It is surrounded by 5.5 hectare park with the Hornbeam Alley and numerous nature monuments. The biggest attractions of the house include excellent cuisine, comfortably furnished rooms and a mini zoo.

Jan III Sobieski Castle is a beautiful neo-gothic palace located south-east of Puck, in the vicinity of the cliff shore of the Bay. The castle offers 50 rooms, renovated historical rooms for meetings, a lodge, sauna, body building gym, billiards and tennis courts.

Zwartowo Palace is located in the south-west part of Choczewo commune. At present this palace and park complex dating from 19th and 20th centuries hosts “Relax” - The Staff Training Centre for Prison Service. The palace offers 32 rooms. The guests may use tennis courts, pitches, a playground, sauna, café and banquet halls.

Prusewo Manor House is situated west of Żarnowieckie Lake, and has been adapted for use as a centre for conferences and relaxation. In the former ballrooms there are a restaurant, café and a conference hall. The building is surrounded by a historic park with old-growth forests, a landscape part and a geometric garden.

Marmułowski Hotel is located at the very heart of Wejherowo – in The Old Town. There are 17 rooms available in different colouring. The hotel arranges parties of different kinds and private evenings in a historical summer-house. It also offers 3 conference rooms.

Paraszyno Manor House was founded in the 2nd half of 18th century. It offers 10 comfortably furnished bedrooms to its guests. Worth mentioning is a restaurant located in beautiful interiors.

Przebendowski-Keyserling Palace which is located near the centre of Wejherowo, houses the Museum of Kashubian and Pomeranian Literature and Music. In the palace founded at the turn of 18th and 19th centuries there are unique manuscripts and old prints related to the Kashubian literary output. Anyone interested in the collections has access to the local reading room. The ground floor houses original wall paintings and polichromies presenting e.g. Mediterranean landscapes.

Krokowa Castle is a pearl of architecture with a rich history. Its interiors house a hotel and a restaurant famous for delicious cuisine. In the spacious halls of the castle there is an exhibition presenting the history of the family von Krokow. The castle is surrounded by a park known all over Europe as of 18th century. Nearby there is The Regional Museum. Visitors of the castle can rest in a quiet and unique atmosphere of its 700-year history.

Below Palace in Sławutówek is situated 200 metres of Reda – Puck route. In 2002 the palace was adapted for use as a centre for hotel and catering business. It offers 35 rooms, a restaurant with regional cuisine, café and a mini zoo.

Leżno Palace dating from 18th century is situated nearby the international airport and the Tri-City ring road. In 1884 it was restored to contemporary condition. The hotel inside it offers 24 rooms including 8 suites, 6 newly-equipped conference-seminar rooms and a restaurant.

Sasino Palace lies in the vicinity of the open sea, clean beaches with dunes and nearby the Stilo Lighthouse. In the palace complex there are a café, restaurant, sauna, solarium and a body building gym. It also offers bike rental, tennis court, multi-use pitches and grill shelter areas.

Starbienino is the seat of The Kashubian Folk University. It is located in a picturesque cottage in the Italian style, by which a hostel was built. Inside there is a conference room accommodating c.a 60 people, seminar rooms, workrooms, dining-kitchen complex, the living area for 65 people (2-person suites) and a café.
